- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Afghan Allies Protec-
- 5 tion Act of 2021".
- 6 SEC. 2. SPECIAL IMMIGRANT VISAS FOR AFGHAN ALLIES.
- 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 602(b)(2)(A)(ii) of the
- 8 Afghan Allies Protection Act of 2009 (8 U.S.C. 1101

1	note) is amended, in the matter preceding subclause (I),
2	by inserting "for the first time" after "submitting a peti-
3	tion".
4	(b) Numerical Limitations.—Section 602(b)(3) of
5	the Afghan Allies Protection Act of 2009 (8 U.S.C. 1101
6	note) is amended—
7	(1) by striking subparagraph (A) and inserting
8	the following:
9	"(A) FISCAL YEAR 2021.—
10	"(i) In general.—In addition to any
11	unused balance under subparagraph (F),
12	for fiscal year 2021, not more than 4,000
13	principal aliens may be granted special im-
14	migrant status under this subsection.
15	"(ii) Period of employment.—For
16	purposes of this subparagraph, the period
17	of employment referred to in paragraph
18	(2)(A)(ii) shall end not later than Decem-
19	ber 31, 2023.
20	"(iii) Application.—For purposes of
21	this subparagraph, not later than Decem-
22	ber 31, 2023, a principal alien seeking spe-
23	cial immigrant status under this subsection
24	shall submit an application to the Chief of
25	Mission.";

14	(A)(i) for use in fiscal year 2021.".

18	"(b) Duration.—The authority under subsection (a)
19	shall expire on the date on which the numerical limitation
20	specified under section 1244 of the National Defense Au-
21	thorization Act for Fiscal Year 2008 (Public Law 110–
22	181; 8 U.S.C. 1157 note) is reached.".
